Our Bible College in Cumbum, Tamil Nadu is a warm and welcoming environment which this year reached out to predominantly Tamil Speaking students. The Students are encouraged to take an active involvement in the mission work of Hope Gardens in addition to their academic studies. We have been so impressed how willing they are to learn new farming techniques in the paddy field, mentored the young students and also adapted to learning under lockdown restrictions.

COLLEGE TOURS - RAMESWARAM & KERALA



These special trips are a chance for the the whole college to come together and reflect on goals and achievements. It is refreshing to get a different perspective by visiting areas of natural beauty, churches and memorials. In Kerala we visited waterfalls, a Tea Estate, a beautiful Roman Catholic Church and played games at Rode Park. 7-9th January we visited Rameswaram and Dhanushkodi. We went to the coast and we visited former President of India Dr.A.P.J. Abdul Kalam's house and his memorial place.

YESU'S STORY

"I stand out in my village it is a militant Hindu community. For my faith I have been beaten. There was an incident where a gang hurt and hospitalised my friends and I. After that, the leader of the gang that beat me became paralyzed, he came to the church, asked for forgiveness and asked me for prayer - what a turnaround. After my RRBC studies I want to return to my community so that these people can know the love of Christ"

LEARNING IN LOCKDOWN

In line with the guidelines from the ATA our faculty members are taking classes in ZOOM, Whatsapp and via group phone calls. Some of the students don't have internet in their villages so some classes are being taken for them via normal phone calls. ATA has asked us conduct the exams in a modified way either by asking students to write assessment papers on each subject or conduct open bible exams.



"I am taking my B.Th II and I have no phone reception. Each morning I climb up a little mountain from the valley below where my home is situated a 30 minute walk just to receive even normal calls. I walk up to the mountain and call at 10am and attend classes that way. I then go home and study. It is slightly different to college life! "Samuel M
