#### VANAKKUM! NEWS FROM RHEMA REVIVAL BIBLE COLLEGE






Please welcome our students for 21/22 who have made many sacrifices to study with us this term. Please pray for their family situations. Many students are facing battles with their family as they are being pressured to give up their studies and work so they can contributed to the family finances which have been so hard hit during the pandemic.

The first semester was unsettled with eight students unable to take up their places due to changes in their circumstances as a result of Covid. Please pray for these 7 students that one day the obstacles to their learning will be lifted and they may have the ability to study Theology.







From the class of 20/21: 3 of our students have already found work and are involved in ministry along with their pastors in their home towns. Fellowship: Covid restrictions have been in place and at times the students have been able to attend church services outdoors. Celebrations have continued but inline with restrictions. Students were able to take a break from exams and attend the Vaigai Dam retreat in January. Fellowship was shared at the "Pongal" celebrations allowed to take place outdoors this year.





Outreach is a vital part of our student's training. As part of their degree the students work alongside our pastors in their social welfare ministries. Due to the pandemic our students have been working in the community supporting our vaccination programme, running food banks and going on home visits as part of our food parcel distribution.

### **EXPANDING OUR MINISTRY**

Vasthi and Gold explain why it is so vital that we reignite our ministry in Theni.



"We really give thanks to God for Theni. After the challenges that Pastor Andrews faced locally we had to stop serving this area during lockdown. Great news! Under the leadership of Appa and Amma (Archbishop Samuel and Saguntha) we have reopened the church! We rid the building of snakes, made the space safe and kickstarted our ministry. We opened a food bank, employed Mrs Rani to lead our children's work and started services. Miraculous things are happening. 135 meals were served at our church even though we only thought 60 would come! It is very challenging being a christian in this village, there is trouble and persecution but we stay strong so we can help the marginalised and be here so that everyone can experience God's love"



**Spotlight on Sathyamangalam:** Godson is an Alumni and he is now working as a pastor in Sathyamangalam district among very poor people living in the hills. The entire region is a dense forest area in TamilNadu and they do not have proper electricity or transport facilities. This is a challenging ministry and we ask for your prayers, we are supporting this new ministry by providing food parcels.



Hope is a retaining wall: Update from Kerala! Rev Robin's retaining wall was built in perfect time to protect the church and his home from the heavy rains that come annually. October was particularly challenging this year but the wall you funded has worked!

Please pray for his ministry and for his recovery after a minor bike accident which required stitches on his leg.
